Required:

1. Helmet

- -**Troxel** or **Ovation** are good, economical brands, look for a "training" or "schooling" helmet with adjustable dial-fit, expect to spend around \$45-\$65
- -can find at Murdoch's, Dover's (in Parker), most local tack shops, or online at State Line Tack, SmartPak, or on Amazon
 - -Bike helmet or other kind of helmet ok for first few lessons

2. Long pants

- -jeans ok
- -riding pants, jodhpurs, or breeches ok
- -some people like to ride in yoga or running pants

3. Closed-toe footwear with a heel and smooth sole (minimal tread)

- -hiking boot ok
- -cowboy boots
- -Ariat, Mt. Horse, Ovation, Dublin are some brands, look for a **paddock boot** or **riding sneaker** so it's useful outside of barn
 - -ABSOLUTELY NO SANDALS
 - -if you come in inappropriate footwear, you may still be allowed to ride without stirrups

Recommended:

- 4. Gloves (REQUIRED FOR GROUNDWORK)
 - -Heritage, Noble Equine, SSG are some brands
 - -Gardening gloves or other thin gloves ok
- 5. Bug spray, sunscreen, sunglasses, water, camera
- 6. Weather-appropriate gear such as rain jacket, warm socks, coat, scarf, gloves, HotHands hand warmers, etc.
- * DO NOT WEAR THE FOLLOWING:
 - -plastic ponchos
 - -any jacket or windbreaker made of flappy, plasticky, noisy material
 - -big, clunky snow boots (may be ok for use on ground, but not safe in stirrup)
 - -flip-flops, sandals, open-toed shoes, high heels, flimsy tennis shoes
 - -rings (including wedding bands) or any dangly or noisy jewelry
